
2025 UNSW Library Plan

The 2025 UNSW Library Plan supports the **UNSW Progress for All Strategy 2025-34** and the 2025 UNSW Operational Plan.

The Library has chosen to take a streamlined approach to this one-year plan, after which there are expected to be three x three years library plans.

Opportunity

Library spaces at Kensington, Paddington, and Canberra campuses support student learning and sense of belonging, and staff productivity and organisational culture.

Response

The Library will continue to work with University stakeholders including Estate Management, Library staff and other partners on continuous improvements to our valued library spaces.

Goal

- Main Library project will be progressed towards new staff and student workspace
- The Digital Knowledge Space pilot will be designed and delivered for Main Library

- Pending Defence project approval, Academy Library Canberra refurbishment project will be progressed
- Canberra City Campus Library "Campus Heart" (E Block CIT Reid Campus) will be progressed

The Library will continue to refine its scholarly collections and deliver world-class, future-focussed content relevant to the UNSW community

Opportunity

NSW Library's valuable research collections of not widely held and Australian materials are maintained for future generations and available to be shared with researchers globally. They support UNSW's innovative research, distinctive education, and commitment to the public good, to deliver progress for all.

Procurement of scholarly resources is subject to market fluctuations and the publishing industry which is undergoing significant change in response to technological change and shifting dynamics in the commercial publishing market.

Response

The Library will work with Estate Management (Sydney) and Estate, Safety & Security (Canberra) to complete the Collection Maintenance Framework projects. This will ensure the preservation and continued access to unique and high value, research print resources, to maintain the scholarly record.

Library to collaborate with partners including CAUL and University stakeholders to identify opportunities to negotiate improved subscription agreements, contain costs and review.

Strategy link

Through accessible education, empower current and future generations. Through research, lead knowledge creation, innovation and translation.

Goal

- Complete stage three of the Collection Maintenance Framework for L3, L6 and L8 Main Library
- Academy Library Canberra Collection Framework will be completed and the Optimisation project significantly progressed
- Partner with CAUL to refine subscription agreements, in response to open access publishing, global inflation, currency fluctuations and increasing costs
- Modernise print borrowing services and install self-service book lockers and investigate RFID
- Improve conservation and storage of research and special collections
- Implement environmentally sustainable GLAMR practices into the award-winning Library Exhibitions program, working with UNSW and local partners. Continue to raise the profile of the program across the sector.

Opportunity

The Library is a key university partner supporting learning, teaching, research and community. Our services, digital and physical infrastructure, and our collections and exhibition are all about empowering students and staff. Our engagement strategy is designed to support, inspire and create moments that matter for our students.

Response

The Library will implement scalable, sustainable programs to increase student and staff awareness, and utilisation of its services to support academic outcomes. The Library will continue to deliver Digital Literacy with an emphasis on smart searching using AI and the ethical use of AI.

Goal

- The Library's digital information skills framework will be refined for in-library and in-faculty delivery to students
- Digital Literacy Package expanded offerings to all in-faculty events

- Library service delivery will be extended to the Canberra City Campus
- Library services will be extended to UNSW College
- Develop programs centred around experiences with our collections including object-based learning, leisure reading for students, and piloting of the Digital Knowledge Space

Library digital infrastructure contributes to excellent research environments. Response



- Continue to work, engaging with university and sector partners, on supporting indigenous knowledges and cultural protocols
